Home-Based ABA vs. School Provided Services

Families with a 3 year-old child on the Autism Spectrum can choose School Services or Home-Based ABA treatment. There are several advantages to insurance-covered, home-based ABA.

Home-Based ABA

Treatment Planner / Decision Maker

BCBA (Board Certified Behavior Analyst) makes treatment decisions



Transparency

Parents can observe any sessions and access data at any time



Parent Involvement and Training

Parents approve goals and tactics weekly and receive hands-on guidance



Paraprofessional Quality

Bachelor's degree required, often enrolled in ABA Masters program



Paraprofessional to Student Ratio

1 to 1 at all times



Generalization to Home

Services occur in the home, so skills are established where they are most needed



School Services

Para-professional or teacher makes treatment decisions

Parents rarely observe sessions or access data

Parents approve goals annually, and receive little to no hands-on training

No bachelor's degree required

Variable throughout day

Services occur in the school, so skills may fail to generalize to the home-setting and to the parents
