

ABA Treatment for Autism through Health Insurance

- Families with a child on the Autism Spectrum can choose Early Intervention or Healthcare-Covered ABA services.
 - Children are eligible to receive ABA services from point of diagnosis to young adulthood.
- There are other distinct differences that healthcare professionals and parents need to be aware of.

Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) makes treatment decisions



Non-credentialed therapist makes treatment decisions

Quality Controls

Therapist supervision by BCBA's occurs in 20% or more of sessions
